She highlighted the importance of understanding multigenerational workforce dynamics and the unique needs of Gen Z workers who prioritize tools that enable fast, smart visual communication. Andy Bricklin discussed the implications of AI on brand governance, noting both the excitement and risks associated with its adoption. He emphasized the need for proper training and tiered permissions to mitigate potential brand reputation damage. Scott Berchman shared insights on maintaining alignment between sales and marketing teams, suggesting early involvement of all stakeholders in project development and the use of AI-enabled tools like Slack to reduce friction and speed up content creation.

The panelists agreed on the necessity of training and proactive change management to ensure successful adoption of new tools and processes. They discussed the balance between enforcing brand standards and allowing creative freedom, with Scott Berchman advocating for a play and discovery mindset to enhance storytelling abilities. Libby Rodney stressed the importance of visual content in creating a brand's vibe, which influences consumer perception and engagement. The session concluded with a discussion on the future of content creation, with predictions about the increasing role of AI assistants and the need for industry standards to manage the authenticity of AI-generated content.
